DFI to Host Town Hall Meetings for Licensees Separate meetings for consumer loan lenders, deferred deposit providers

FRANKFORT, Ky. (June 28, 2019) – In July, the Kentucky Department of Financial Institutions (DFI) will host two types of town hall meetings, one for consumer loan lenders and one for deferred deposit services licensees. The meetings will take place in Bowling Green and Winchester.

DFI will hold two consumer loan lender town halls, one July 22nd in Bowling Green and one July 25th in Winchester. The same program will be presented on both days. Attendance at one of the two dates is suggested.

The Department will also host two deferred deposit service business and check cashing licensee events, one July 23rd in Bowling Green and one July 24th in Winchester. Licensees are also encouraged to select one meeting to attend.

Each town hall will include information and demonstrations from staff from DFI, Veritec Solutions, and the Conference of State Bank Supervisors regarding changes to the Nationwide Multistate Licensing System and the Veritec Database System. Each event will also include a discussion of applicable statutes which were enacted during the 2019 legislative session.
