**AGREED ORDER**

BUCKEYE CHECK CASHING OF KENTUCKY, INC.  
D/B/A CHECK\$MART (Lic # CC13962)

RESPONDENT

1. The Department of Financial Institutions (“DFI”) is responsible for regulating and licensing entities engaged in the business of cashing checks and accepting deferred deposit transactions in accordance with the provisions set forth in KRS Chapter 286.9.

2. Buckeye Check Cashing Of Kentucky, Inc., d/b/a Check\$mart (“Respondent”) is authorized to do business in Kentucky as a deferred deposit and check cashing licensee pursuant to KRS Chapter 286.9, with an office located at 5005 Preston Highway, Louisville, KY 40213 with Deferred Deposit License # CC13962. (ICIE # 305740)

3. DFI conducted a routine examination of Respondent on August 8, 2014. During the examination, the DFI examiners reported that Respondent had three violations.

4. DFI found that Respondent closed customer “JL” loan in the Veritec database when the customer still owed on the loan. When the loan was reopened, it was discovered that the customer had entered into a deferred deposit transaction which exceeded limits allowed under KRS 286.9 in violation of KRS 286.9-100(9) and KRS 286.9-140(1).

5. Additionally, DFI found that Respondent closed customers "CL" and "AG"s loans in the Veritec database when the customers still owed on the loans. When the loans were reopened, it was discovered that the customers had entered into a deferred deposit transactions which exceeded limits allowed under KRS 286.9 in violation of KRS 286.9-100(9) and KRS 286.9-140(1). Respondent disputes these violations.

6. In the interest of economically and efficiently resolving the violations contained in the examination report dated August 8, 2014, in lieu of litigation, for customer "CL" and customer "AG", DFI and Respondent agree to resolve the issues with this agreed order and with the payment of an agreed upon fine consistent with the amount assessed for the violation of customer "JL".

7. DFI possesses a range of administrative authority in addressing violations of the Act, including license revocation or denial, as well as the imposition of civil penalties in an amount up to \$5,000 per violation. See KRS 286.9-110; 286.9-991.

8. In this case, the DFI assessed a civil penalty against Respondent in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the above-described violations of KRS 286.9-100(9) and 286.9-140(1) and for the resolution of the remaining alleged violations.

9. In the interest of economically and efficiently resolving all violation(s) described herein, and without Respondent admitting or denying the statements of fact and legal conclusions herein, DFI and Respondent agree as follows:

- a. Respondent agrees to a civil penalty assessment in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for each of the violation(s) described herein;

b. Respondent agrees to and shall pay the total civil penalty assessed herein of three thousand dollars (\$3,000), which shall be due upon entry of the Agreed Order. The payment shall be in the form of a certified check or money order made payable to "Kentucky State Treasurer" and mailed to the Department of Financial Institutions, Attn: Non-Depository Division - Order, 1025 Capital Center Drive, Suite 200, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601;

c. Respondent agrees to make restitution, by check drawn on the Respondent's account, to all affected customers by refunding the service fees on the transactions that created the database violation and to maintain records – consistent with KRS 286.9-074 – that such refund checks were issued to the customers and were processed for payment by the customer; and

d. Respondent shall devote the time and resources necessary to ensure continual and full compliance with all statutory requirements set forth in KRS Chapter 286.9.

7. Respondent waives its right to demand a hearing at which it would be entitled to legal representation, to confront and cross examine witnesses, and to present evidence on its own behalf, or to otherwise appeal or set aside this Order.

8. Respondent consents to and acknowledges the jurisdiction of DFI over this matter and that this Agreed Order is a matter of public record and may be disseminated as such.

9. In consideration of execution of this Agreed Order, Respondent for itself, and for its successors and assigns, hereby releases and forever discharges the

Commonwealth of Kentucky, DFI, Office of Legal Services, and each of their members, agents, and employees in their individual capacities, from any and all manner of actions, causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and unknown, in law or equity, that Respondent ever had, now has, may have or claim to have against any or all of the persons or entities named in this paragraph arising out of or by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action, this settlement or its administration.

10. By signing below, the parties acknowledge they have read the foregoing Agreed Order, know and fully understand its contents, and that they are authorized to enter into and execute this Agreed Order and legally bind their respective parties.

11. This Agreed Order shall constitute the Final Order in this matter.
