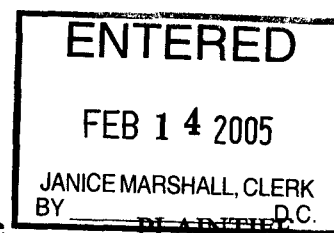

AGREED ORDER PURSUANT TO CR 65

Upon mutual Agreement of the Plaintiff, the Executive Director ("Executive
Director") of the Office of Financial Institutions Of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
("Office"), and the Defendants, Floco Management, LLC, and Steve A. Wallace,
personally, this Court being otherwise sufficiently advised;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Defendants, Floco Management, LLC, and Steve A. Wallace, shall no longer engage
in any aspect of the business of offering or selling securities at any time for any reason.
Neither Defendant shall engage in any aspect of such securities business within or outside
of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
2. The Defendants shall never violate the Securities Act of Kentucky in the future. In
addition, the Defendants shall never violate the regulations enacted under the Securities
Act of Kentucky or the Orders of the Executive Directors of the Office or the
Commissioners of the Department of Financial Institutions that remain in force.
3. Steve A. Wallace shall not offer or sell securities and/or interests in any oil and gas
venture from Kentucky to non-Kentucky residents or to Kentucky residents nor shall he

offer or sell such securities and/or interests from outside Kentucky to residents of Kentucky. This shall include, but not be limited to, interests in oil and gas ventures in the form of partnerships, limited partnerships, joint ventures, corporations, and limited liability companies.

4. Steve A. Wallace shall not be an officer, director, manager, or other such control person of any entity which offers or sells securities and/or interests in oil and gas ventures from Kentucky to non-Kentucky residents or to Kentucky residents or which offers or sells such securities and/or interests from outside Kentucky to Kentucky residents.

5. Steve A. Wallace shall not have any direct or indirect ownership interest in any entity which offers or sells securities and/or interests in oil and gas ventures from Kentucky to non-Kentucky residents or to Kentucky residents or from outside Kentucky to Kentucky residents.

6. Steve A. Wallace shall receive no commission, remuneration, or financial benefit from the offer or sale of any securities from Kentucky to non-Kentucky residents or to Kentucky residents or from the offer or sale of such securities and/or interests from outside Kentucky to Kentucky residents.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

7. Notwithstanding this Order, Steve A. Wallace may continue to engage in the business of drilling for oil and/or gas within and outside of the Commonwealth of Kentucky for compensation commensurate with his efforts to do same. This allows Steve A. Wallace, among other things, to do things like secure drilling equipment, oversee the drilling operations or actually operate a drilling rig, assist in any of these tasks, or advise in connection with these tasks.

8. This express permission for Defendant Steve A. Wallace to engage in the business of drilling for oil and/or gas permits him to engage in any aspect of said drilling business **EXCEPT** for the raising of the money to drill the wells and receiving remuneration and/or commission from such raising of money to drill said wells. Nevertheless, this Order shall *not* prevent Steve A. Wallace from receiving fair market compensation for any work performed in the act of drilling oil and/or gas wells and functions related thereto, **EXCEPTING** the work of raising the money to fund said activities.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

9. Steve A. Wallace shall not receive compensation, remuneration, dividends, gains, or income of any sort whatsoever, through any company or entity that he would not be permitted to receive directly pursuant to the terms of this Order.
