AGREED ORDER

1. The Department of Financial Institutions (“DFI”) is responsible for regulating and licensing entities engaged in the business of cashing checks and accepting deferred deposit transactions in accordance with the provisions set forth in KRS Chapter 286.9.

2. Hershel Arrowood (“Respondent”) is a sole proprietor doing business as J & J Gun and Pawn, with an office located at 2470 Highway 15 North in Jackson, Kentucky 41339.

3. DFI conducted an investigation of Respondent on June 7, 2017. During the investigation, DFI discovered that the Respondent was engaging in deferred deposit transactions without a license from DFI, in violation of KRS 286.9-020.

4. DFI possesses a range of administrative authority in addressing violations of the Act, including license revocation or denial, as well as the imposition of civil penalties in an amount up to \$5,000 per violation. *See* KRS 286.9-110; 286.9-991.

5. In this case, DFI assessed a civil penalty against Respondent in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for the above-described violations of KRS 286.9-020.

6. In the interest of economically and efficiently resolving the violation(s) described herein, and without Respondent admitting or denying the statements of fact and legal conclusions herein, DFI and Respondent agree as follows:

- a. Respondent agrees to a civil penalty assessment in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the violation(s) described herein;
- b. Respondent agrees to and shall pay the total civil penalty assessed herein of two thousand dollars (\$2,000), which shall be due upon entry of the Agreed Order. The payment shall be in the form of a certified check or money order made payable to “Kentucky State Treasurer” and mailed to the Department of Financial Institutions, Attn: Non-Depository Division – Agreed Order, 1025 Capital Center Drive, Suite 200, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601;
- c. Respondent agrees to make restitution, by check drawn on the Respondent’s account, to all affected customers by refunding the principal and service fees on the transactions that created the violations described herein;
- d. Respondent agrees to submit proof to DFI that the restitution described herein has been made within thirty (30) calendar days of the entry of this Order; and
- e. Respondent shall devote the time and resources necessary to ensure continual and full compliance with all statutory requirements set forth in KRS Chapter 286.9.

7. Respondent waives its right to demand a hearing at which it would be entitled to legal representation, to confront and cross examine witnesses, and to present evidence on its own behalf, or to otherwise appeal or set aside this Order.


8. Respondent consents to and acknowledges the jurisdiction of DFI over this matter and that this Agreed Order is a matter of public record and may be disseminated as such.

In consideration of execution of this Agreed Order, Respondent for itself, and for its successors and assigns, hereby releases and forever discharges the Commonwealth of Kentucky, DFI, Office of Legal Services, and each of their members, agents, and employees in their individual capacities, from any and all manner of actions, causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and unknown, in law or equity, that Respondent ever had, now has, may have or claim to have against any or all of the persons or entities named in this paragraph arising out of or by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action, this settlement or its administration.


10. By signing below, the parties acknowledge they have read the foregoing Agreed Order, know and fully understand its contents, and that they are authorized to enter into and execute this Agreed Order and legally bind their respective parties.

11. This Agreed Order shall constitute the Final Order in this matter.
