AGREED ORDER

QC FINANCIAL SERVICES, LLC

RESPONDENT

1. The Department of Financial Institutions ("DFI") is responsible for regulating and licensing entities engaged in the business of cashing checks and accepting deferred deposit transactions in accordance with the provisions set forth in KRS Chapter 286.9.

2. QC Financial Services, LLC ("Respondent") is authorized to do business in Kentucky as a check casher licensee pursuant to KRS Chapter 286.9, with an office located at 8208 Melrose Drive, Lenexa, KS 66214. Respondent's Kentucky license number is #DDR711350.

3. On June 4, 2024, DFI conducted a routine examination of Respondent's location at 470 East New Circle Road, Lexington, Kentucky, 40505.

4. On May 29-30, 2024, and on July 9, 10, and 14, 2025, DFI conducted examinations of Respondent's location at 3101 Richmond Road, Lexington, Kentucky 40509.

5. On March 13, 2025, DFI conducted an examination of Respondent's location at 7101 Southside Drive, Louisville, Kentucky 40214.

6. The examinations revealed that Respondent violated KRS 286.9-100(9) multiple times by exceeding the limit of proceeds that may be received by a single customer.

7. The examinations also revealed that Respondent violated KRS 286.9-140(1)(b) multiple times by entering incorrect social security numbers into the Catalis database.

8. The examinations also revealed that Respondent violated 808 KAR 9:010 Section 2 by reopening transactions for non-clerical reasons.

9. DFI possesses a range of administrative authority in addressing violations of KRS Chapter 286.9, including license revocation or denial, as well as the imposition of civil penalties in an amount up to \$5,000 per violation. See KRS 286.9-110; 286.9-991.

10. In this case, the DFI assessed a civil penalty against Respondent in the amount of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) for the above-referenced violations.

11. In the interest of economically and efficiently resolving the violation(s) described herein, and without Respondent admitting or denying the statements of fact and legal conclusions herein, DFI and Respondent agree as follows:

a. Respondent agrees to a civil penalty assessment in the amount of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) for the violation(s) described herein;

b. Respondent agrees to and shall pay the total civil penalty assessed herein of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000), which shall be due within thirty (30) days after entry of the Agreed Order. The payment shall be made through the NMLS system by invoice created by DFI; and

c. Respondent shall devote the time and resources necessary to ensure continual and full compliance with all statutory requirements set forth in KRS Chapter 286.9.

12. Respondent waives its right to demand a hearing at which it would be entitled to legal representation, to confront and cross-examine witnesses, and to present evidence on its own behalf, or to otherwise appeal or set aside this Order.


13. Respondent consents to and acknowledges the jurisdiction of DFI over this matter and that this Agreed Order is a matter of public record and may be disseminated as such.

14. In consideration of execution of this Agreed Order, Respondent for itself, and for its successors and assigns, hereby releases and forever discharges the Commonwealth of Kentucky, DFI, Office of Legal Services, and each of their members, agents, and employees in their individual capacities, from any and all manner of actions, causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and unknown, in law or equity, that Respondent ever had, now has, may have or claim to have against any or all of the persons or entities named in this paragraph arising out of or by reason of this investigation, this disciplinary action, this settlement or its administration.

15. By signing below, the parties acknowledge they have read the foregoing Agreed Order, know and fully understand its contents, and that they are authorized to enter into and execute this Agreed Order and legally bind their respective parties.

16. This Agreed Order shall constitute the Final Order in this matter.



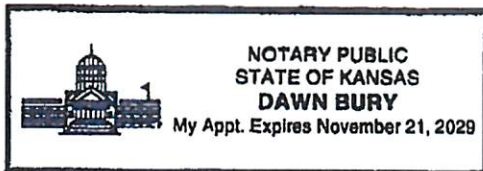
